


Development Committee Westside Library Park

Background

- Land purchased by Library in 2022 for permanent westside library location
- "A park in a library and a library in a park" vision
- Concept planning for park component
 - Approximately 6 acres





Background

- Joint project between Parks and Recreation, Community Development, and Library
- City awarded contract to Genus Landscape Architects
 - Subcontractor with OPN on Library portion of project





Previous Planning Efforts

- Known desire for additional park space and amenities such as a water feature, dog park, community garden, walking trails, and space for youth activities
 - Westdale Area Action
 Plan
 - Community Gardens in Parks Plan




Reading Rooms







"It should be comfortable but allow multiple groups and individuals an enjoyable place to read in the outdoors and natural elements"




"It would be nice to have kid specific spaces...then other areas for adults"

"I think having a playground that is more organic in style would be very unique...it would a great opportunity to do something different."










"Playgrounds that are inclusive are the most important"

 - Vandalism, homelessness, cost, maintenance




Important Considerations
