




PERCENT OF POPULATION AGE 65+
























A 10-year American child today has a






9 in 10 50-plus adults rate Cedar Rapids good or better for aging-in-community



Q2 - How would you rate Cedar Rapids as a place for people to live as they age? (*n*=341)




A majority of 50-plus adults in Cedar Rapids have lived there at least half their life



Q4 - How long have you lived in Cedar Rapids? (n=356)




About half of Cedar Rapids older adults say it's unlikely they will move residences during nonworking retirement years



Q5 - Thinking about your retirement years when you do not work at all for pay, how likely is it that you will move to a different residence in Cedar **Rapids?** (*n*=356)




2 in 3 Cedar Rapids older adults say it is unlikely they will move outside the community in their non-working retirement years




All Cedar Rapids 50-plus adults report that staying active as they age is important



Most older adults in Cedar Rapids do not have a disability that limits their ability to participate in activities like work and school







Building the Team


- Local officials, leaders and residents are important partners
